Please stop in to pick up your box as soon as possible. Boxes that are not claimed within 2 weeks of delivery will be offered to other clients.

## STATE OF THE CENTER – 2023

During 2023, we said good-bye to long-time van driver Tami Gehr and welcomed Dennis Stemen and Christine Diaz as new van drivers. Cathy Kelly (5 years) went down to a sub van driver and Jim Knebel (4 years) moved from sub van driver to transportation coordinator. Our current staff also includes Alice Curth (19 years with 9 of those years in Outreach) as Executive Director, Angie Goodwin (32 years) as Office Manager, Gloria Baughn (2 years) as Outreach Worker, Dave Stemen (12 years) as Van Driver, Wil Baughn (2 years) as Van Driver, Frank Dorsten (4 years) as Sub Van Driver, Joe Clark (6 years) as Chore Supervisor, and Roger Mauk (2 years) as a Seasonal Chore Worker. Mary Jo Behrns, Office Aide (3 years), has recently decided to retire. We have just recently hired more van drivers, Carl Heatwole and Ken Wise. We retired two of our vehicles last year and were fortunate enough to replace them with two brand new Ford Transit vehicles. We are excited that our new west parking lot is completed as well! I am happy to report that all of our numbers for each of our core services and activities that we offer increased in 2023! I love that more seniors are using the Center. We are here for you!

Transportation to medical appointments is our primary service. In 2023, we transported 277 different clients for a total of 3,716 trips. We have four vehicles on the road and one back-up vehicle. They are all wheel-chair accessible and traveled 49,370 miles last year. We transport around the Delphos area, as well as Lima, Van Wert and Spencerville. We will transport up to 100 miles one way within Ohio if the trip is covered under one of our contracts. Our main priority is medical, but we also transport to banks and grocery stores locally. We generally serve those over 60 years of age, but some contracts allow us to help those under 60 as well.

Our Chore program served 30 different clients with over 676 hours of service. Much of those service hours were lawn mowing. The Chore Department also takes care of all the cleaning and maintenance here at the Center. For Chore service, you need to be over 60 years of age and live in the Delphos area.

Outreach served 207 different clients for 514 contacts. Many of those contacts were related to Medicare Open Enrollment services, during which time we saved local seniors over \$48,000! Our Outreach Worker, Gloria Baughn, is OSHIIP-certified to offer Medicare counseling. The Outreach Department also offers the Matter of Balance course and our monthly Good to Know programs. During 2023, we offered the Matter of Balance program twice, serving 20 seniors. Our Good to Know, Lunch & Go programs served 82 different clients with a total of 387 contacts. We also offered the WISE program in March serving 11 different seniors. Our cell phone clinic helped out 12 different seniors, and there were 17 individuals who attended the OSHIIP-led Medicare Open Enrollment brunch. We sponsored a Health Fair in October which was very well-attended! We are so happy that you are using the Center and the resources that we are able to provide for you!

The only health assessment currently offered at the Center is the Foot Care Clinic provided by Community Health Professionals. We served 90 seniors with this service in 2023. In addition, we have loaned out lots of durable medical equipment during the year. We are grateful to be able to offer this service to the community.

Exercise is our most popular activity, followed closely by special bingo! We also offer bridge, Friday Funday activities like crafts, board games and wii bowling, parties and painting activities. These activities reached a total of 3,714 participants! In 2023, a sewing group started up and they are working on a quilt to raffle for the benefit of the Center! In 2024, we have brought back the meal site three days a week. I'm sure there will be more new offerings throughout the year. We are always trying to think of ways to better serve the seniors in Delphos. Watch the newsletter for more activities, or give us a call at 419-692-1331. There is surely something to spark your interest – please give us a try! If you don't see something you like, let us know and we will do our best to accommodate.

Delphos Senior Citizens is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of eleven local residents. We receive funding for the Center from a variety of sources. These include portions of the Senior Citizens Services levies in Allen County (15%) and one of the levies in Van Wert County (16%), United Way, the Dienstberger Foundation, contracts with area nursing homes and the Allen County Department of Job & Family Services, as well as donations from individuals and organizations. Many individuals have chosen to contribute to our Memorial Fund in remembrance of a loved one. We have raffles and 50/50 drawings at our parties. We plan to try a couple of new fundraisers as well. We are very grateful for all of the continued support we receive from our community!

When you think of Delphos Senior Citizens, I hope you remember the services we provide to help seniors live more independently. Maintaining a healthy quality of life is of utmost importance, and enhancing that life with opportunities for socialization is the next priority. I think the services and activities that we offer fill a gap in transportation in this community, and also provide some uplifting social opportunities to enrich a senior's daily life. The desire to care for those who cared for us is hardwired into our brains, and, for most of us, provides a sense of well-being as we grow older.

Remember, at Delphos Senior Citizens, there is no membership fee and most services are provided at no charge. We are happy to accept donations. We have a Memorial Fund to remember loved ones. If you have any questions or suggestions, please call 419-692-1331.
